Training on the working place

Working place training + Academic (theory + practice)



How it works

- Real world and academic training
 - 3 modules
 - Weekly 10 5 Workshop
 - Weekly star visits from the world of football
 - Covering football every week





Football Journalism at Derby

- Started in September 2016
- Unique in the country
- Highly competitive
- Small cohorts (25 per year)
- Over 1000 matches covered in three semesters







Engagement with women's football

- Euro 17 televised live on Channel
 4
- Unprecedented crowds and viewing figures
- Increasing flow of money on Women football (salaries, sponsors, audiences, etc).









Conception

- Idea was born before the Football Journalism Programme
- Reporting on Women's International during the freshers' week






Preparation

- UEFA verbally agreed the deal in February
- Students reporting from press boxes every week
- Filing live, for coursework, local papers, own website, on Twitter
- Getting used to the logistics of the business









Logistical challenges

- Working out rough costings
- Students paid £100 deposit
- Sorting travel own/ uni/ students cars, ferries
- Arranging accommodation in city, or remote
- Allocating students in groups to teams/ matches/ likely press conferences
- Approaching regional outlets and clubs offering our services

KEY: STAR = GAME CIRCLE = PRESS CON SQUARE = BASE








