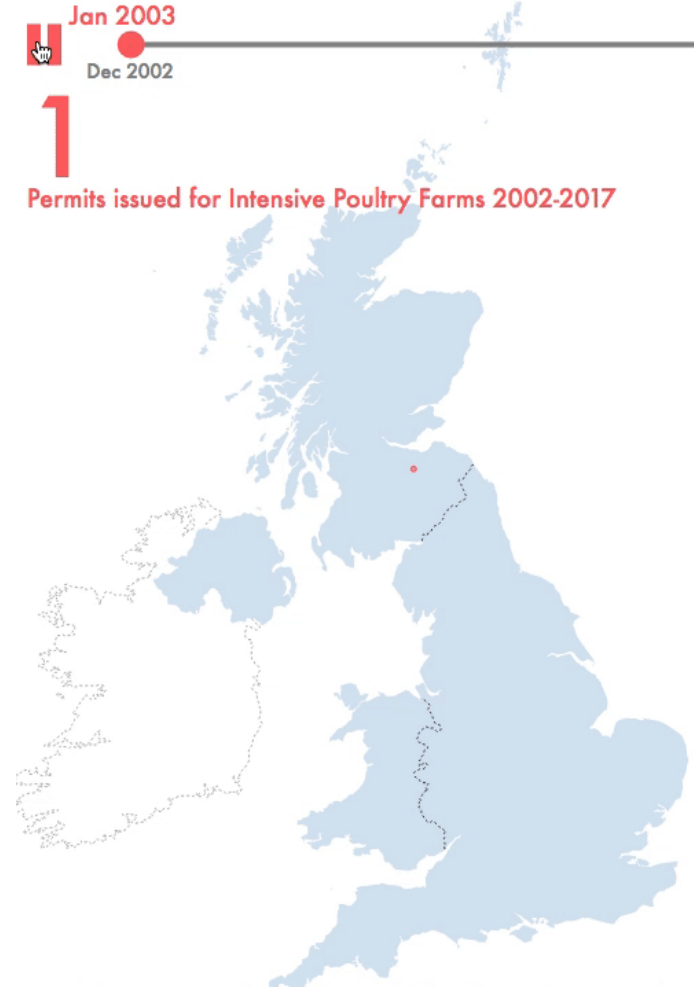

### **Overview**

In February 2017, the Department for Communities and Local Government [announced](#) a £20m pot for refuge funding.

Seventy-six projects across the country were chosen to receive a share of £20 million “to support victims of domestic abuse, creating more than 2,200 new bed spaces in refuges and other specialist accommodation” over two years.

At the time, Communities Secretary Sajid Javid said: “This significant investment shows our clear commitment to supporting and strengthening a resilient network of refuge services across the country, with further specialist support to help victims go on to rebuild their lives.”

However, the Bureau has heard that some refuges included in the bids are yet to see any of the money they were promised. From what we understand, the money has been passed on by DCLG, but in some cases it has not been passed on from the local councils to the partners on the ground, (i.e. the refuges and NGOs.)

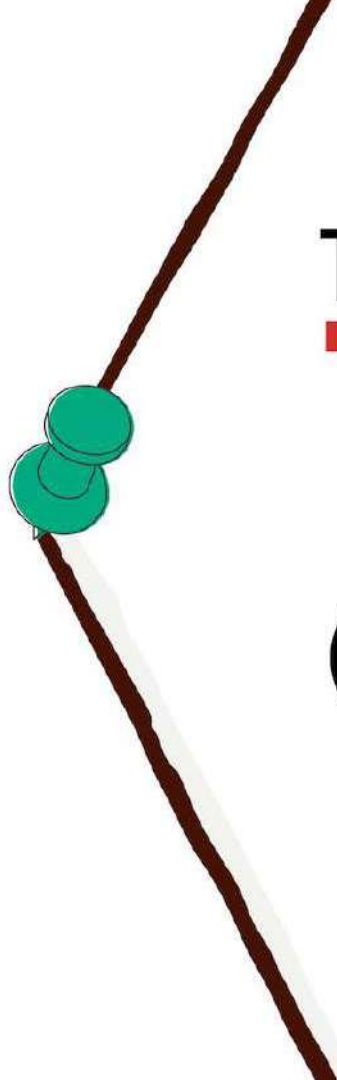

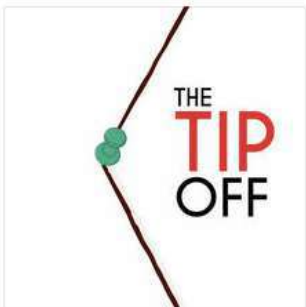

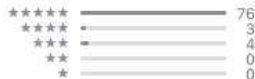
