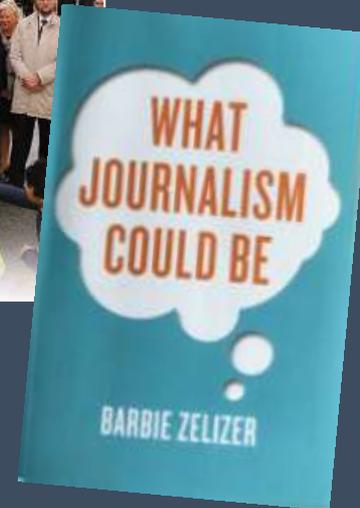

# Becoming a journalist amid changing tradition

## Becoming dispositions and attitudes

*The desire to be impartial, objective and detached*

*The desire to develop a self brand and curate identity while marketing and selling stories*

***The story of 'me' and the story of 'you'***



## Becoming storytellers

*A desire to campaign and investigate*

***Public service motivation v self interest***

## Becoming skills

*The desire to acquire traditional NCTJ skills while being proficient in multimedia, data handling, social media and analytics*

***"I've noticed a shift with stories ... will enough people click on it? If not, is it really worthwhile? It's all about efficiency"***

## Hierarchical becoming

*Valued roles include those requiring writing, "hunting for stories" and being "on the frontline"*

***"To me a typical journalist is someone getting answers out in the field. But only a small number do this. Too many are happy being passive. It's a resigned case of 'This is just how it is, it's online, I'll just sit here and react to what comes in'"***
